Attendance Registers

Our school has just changed to electronic attendance registers. This means the roll is taken at 8.45am and if the child is not there they are automatically marked 'absent'. If the front gate is shut, children will need to come in via reception for a late pass. The 15 minute amnesty we had in the past now no longer applies.

Children should be at school by 8.30am so that they are in class ready for the roll call at 8.45am.

If your child is late and cannot reach the latch, please teach them to come to school via Tramway Road and through Reception.

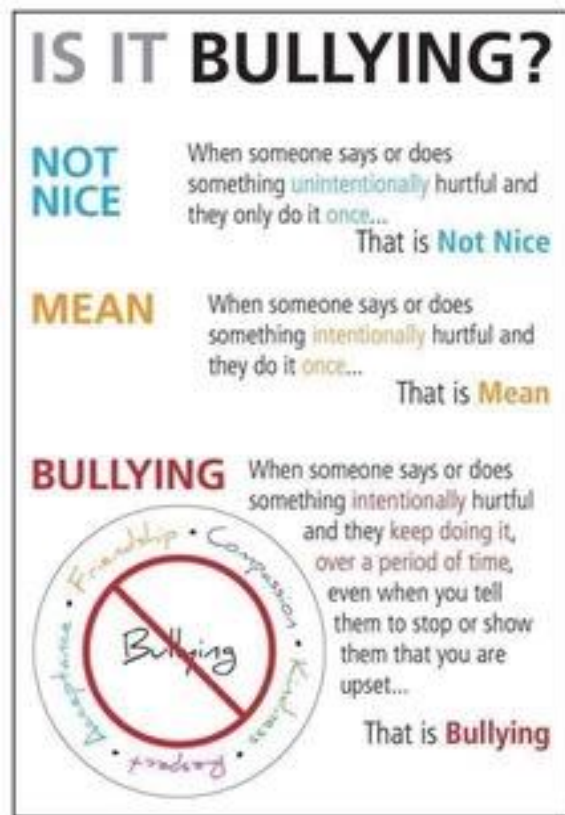
Board of Trustees Next Election 2019
